HIGHLIGHTS

- Multiple arrests at 7-Eleven locations: Harassment, aggressive panhandling, loitering, trespassing.
- Arrest: \$1,800 theft from Kroger; suspect is a repeat offender.
- ENP Officer conducted a traffic stop on a suspicious vehicle that failed to stop at a red light. Driver had no active warrants but a recent history of multiple BMVs and thefts. Driver was issued a citation advised of dedicated and increased ENP patrols.
- UCPID ENP continues to address panhandling within the district. Several citations for pedestrian in the roadway have been issued, as well as arrests for outstanding warrants.




ENP Officers routinely patrol the old CVS location and remove individuals, and in some cases, issuing citations.
